A Message from Our President Julie Stern

Our Vice President this year is Christine Gary, another historic home owner from within the "circle". Our Secretary this year will be Kathleen Dever, who also lives in a relo-

cated historic home. Richard Winn will return as our Treasurer.

The City of Corona has a rich and vibrant history and has been prominent in the development of Southern California citrus culture and history. We are a town of people from virtually every walk of life that works together to preserve a community that is beautiful, safe and honors it heritage. The City has many public resources and events that promote Corona's unique history and community involvement. CHPS partners with the city in many roles to act as a resource and advocate of our local historical resources and to protect these resources. I am very honored to have been chosen to be a part of this.

This year is our 24th anniversary and it is a very exciting year for us. CHPS has a full calendar of events planned for 2007. We hope to see as many of our members as possible at these events and I hope to get to know as many of you as possible. To lead off the year we co-hosted the Chamber of Commerce MegaMixer in February and Mary Winn provided a beautiful PowerPoint presentation of historic images related to the 24-year history of our organization and its participation in historic events and activities in the City of Corona. For our first Quarterly Meeting in March, we will have a slide show presentation of the historic Mission Inn, at the Historic Civic Center. On May 12 the CHPS will be hosting the 2007 Vintage Home Tour featuring tours of 5 interesting historic homes, of varying architectural styles, located on Grand Boulevard and Palm Ave. In June we will be at

the Old Tyme Community Picnic and the Antiques and Collectibles Faire. In October we will be at the Lemon Festival and present the famed Annual Cemetery Walk honoring Corona's prominent historical figures on October 28. In December, we have scheduled our general meeting and annual holiday party.

Other big news, this year CHPS will be awarding 4 Heritage Home awards to historic home owners for their efforts towards restoring and beautify-

ing their historic homes. Two of these are for 2006 that we were unable to present at the annual holiday party and two for this year. In addition to the Heritage Home plaque, suitable for placing on the structure, a cash award will be presented to help defray, in some small way, the significant cost of restoration efforts. In this newsletter you will find a detailed article about the awards and how they will be distributed.

Some of our special events this year are a dedication ceremony to honor the placement of the Historic Civic Center (2nd Corona High School and 2nd City Hall) on The National Register of Historic Places, placing historic markers, assisting the City in drafting an historic or heritage tree ordinance, assisting historic district residents with the Landmark / Mills Act process, promoting the use of sympathetic architecture for commercial structures in Historic Districts within the "circle", and updating the City's Heritage Inventory of meritorious historic homes from the 1940s and 1950s.

As you can see, we have a very busy year ahead of us and we welcome all volunteers. 

Heritage Home Awards by Julie Stern

CHPS is proud to announce that a monetary award will accompany the presentation of Heritage Home award plaques and certificates for 2006 and 2007. The awards will be presented to four homeowners. Two of these are for 2006 that were unable to be presented at the annual holiday party and two for this year. In addition to the Heritage Home plaque, suitable for permanent installation on the structure, and a certificate honoring the homeowner, a token cash award will accompany the awards to help defray, in some small way, the significant cost of restoration efforts that have met the criteria listed below.

The Society would like to encourage and foster more loving restoration or preservation of vintage homes. This award will recognize a structure as one of Corona's valuable historic homes. CHPS will award such recognition annually with the awards to be presented at the Old Tyme Picnic, so that the general public will be able to participate in this auspicious event .The award is a monetary gift of \$250.00.

Criteria:

- 1) The homeowner's efforts will have resulted in the preservation of a home that might have been otherwise lost to blight, dilapidation and/or demolition.
- 2) Such efforts may also result in restoring a structure to original or near original condition and/or historical correctness.
- 3) Property must be listed on the city's Heritage Inventory List .
- 4) Restoration must be historically accurate.
- 5) Must involve substantial renovation resulting in restoration of structural integrity, architectural designs, construction materials (doors, windows, flooring, etc.) and fixtures.



Corona Paper Route by Gilbert Belcher

I think it was in 1941 and 1942, I had a paper route. The paper was the *Evening Herald Express*, printed in Los Angeles, California.

I'd ride my bike to school one and a half miles. I could almost coast down town after school to get my papers. They sold for five cents of which I got one and a half cents if it was a delivery paper; if the paper was sold on the street, the seller got one cent per paper.

My route, which I developed myself, had at times twenty to thirty-five customers, some a half mile apart. We lived at 1203 West 6th Street, one and a half miles from the center of town.

There was a vacant lot between the theater and the Studebaker agency and three boys had a Model A Ford roadster. They got out of school early and raced into L.A., fifty-five miles , to get the papers. They folded papers and met paper boys at the lot.

All rubber went to the war effort so there were no rubber bands to put around papers. A good job of folding allowed one to throw a paper to the house.

I had several customers close together on 6th Street which helped to lessen the weight as the last of the route was long. If there was big war news, the paper had "Extra" in big red letters and I would get ten extra copies in hopes of selling them.

The last place on the west side of Corona was the Tri-Angle Café and beer joint. That is where I would sell the extra papers from my last delivery paper on Smith Street; it

was half a mile to the Tri-Angle Café. My mind, at this point, was torn between a big candy bar or to listen to "The Bob Wills Band" play "The Steel Guitar Rag" on the jukebox. I most always spent a nickel there.

It was one quarter mile home and dark (already). Mom saved a meal for me. She always kept my paper records and she'd say, "Gilbert, you're losing five cents a day." I never told her of my Indulgence..

Note: Mr. Belcher wrote a booklet sharing lifetime experiences, especially during World War II, and sent a copy to CHPS. He graduated from Corona High with the class of "45" and continues to attend class reunions. This photo was scanned from his booklet and was taken in 2002. This story was sent to CHPS in addition to his booklet.
